From the turn of the twentieth century onward, European intellectual and artistic circles increasingly engaged with Chinese classics, supported by the institutionalization of sinology and the rise of international esoteric and literary networks. Within this context, Daoist texts became particularly influential, owing to their interpretive openness and their capacity to be reshaped across cultural and philosophical settings. This process has continued in recent decades, with Daoism acquiring renewed significance globally. This talk explores the reception and popularization of Daoism in the Western world, focusing on its contemporary reinterpretations. It examines how particular readings of Daoist philosophy have shaped its dissemination and enhanced its relevance in today's globalized world.

Guest Lecturer: Filippo COSTANTINI (Ph.D.) is currently an Assistant Professor of Chinese Studies at the University of Cagliari. His research covers Song dynasty Neo-Confucianism, pre-Qin and Han Daoist philosophy, and the reception of Daoism in the West. He has authored and edited three books, and his works have appeared in various international journals (*Asian Studies*, *Frontiers of Philosophy in China*, *Religions*, among others) etc.
