A New Dimension of Ethics for Living with 89 Seconds Left on the Doomsday Clock

Summary of the session (100 words)

The session began with a keynote address highlighting the urgency of rethinking ethics in an era of unprecedented global risks. The subsequent symposium brought together six speakers, each addressing themes such as trust, coexistence, desire, gift, tolerance, and sustainability. Through dynamic exchanges, the dialogue deepened our understanding of how ethics must engage not only the future but the immediacy of the present. The session emphasized the importance of relational intelligence, cultural memory, and inner transformation in responding to planetary crises—offering not a singular solution, but a renewed ethical imagination for living with 89 seconds left on the Doomsday Clock.
